


We wrote this zine because we are parenting our child in a "gender open" way (more on this later). AND because this is a new way of parenting there isn't a lot of info out there, and you might have some questions...

WHY are we raising our kid in a GENDER OPEN way?

Raising our kid GENDER OPEN stems from our belief in CHILD-CENTERED parenting — that is, allowing our child to be exactly who they are, and not who we THINK they should be!



For us, this is simply a matter of RESPECTING their UNIQUE INDIVIDUALITY

What does it mean to raise a child in a gender open way?



For us, gender open* does not mean gender neutral— there is a whole universe of gender and sex expressions out there and we affirm our child's right to be whatever combination of these expressions work for them (regardless of how society labels their anatomy).



*Gender open parenting is sometimes referred to as gender affirming parenting.



- Using they/them/their instead of gendered pronouns like he or she




Did you know...



- Allowing for a full range of gender and sex self-expressions




- Giving our child a variety of clothes, toys, activities, stories, make beliefs, costumes, etc.
- Not making assumptions based on body parts and not pre-assigning their sex or gender

- Recognizing that we don't know what our child's sex or gender is until they tell us




- Knowing that sex and gender expressions may change over time

- Listening to what our child says about who they are, including their gender and sex



Absolutely


NOT!

It is not an experiment to parent in a way consistent with our values and community norms.

Our child will tell us who they are when they can, and it is our job as parents to not only accept them, but to fiercely support them in expressing themselves.

Many people throughout their life will tell them who they should be, doesn't it make sense for them to have people that accept them for who they

ARE?



Are you harming your child?

Actually, we believe that letting our child be exactly who they are and not making assumptions about their gender or sex will do the opposite - allow them to grow up knowing that their expressions will be respected and honoured by their parents.



We've seen many people be harmed and limited by a narrow, binary sex and gender system and we really want freedom and limitless possibilities for our child.



What if I don't agree with you?

We don't expect **EVERYONE** to agree with our parenting, **BUT** we **DO** expect those in our lives and our child's life to **RESPECT** it (and us!).



To be clear, while there may be times we are **OPEN** to conversation on this topic, we are **NOT** looking to **DEBATE** it.

Arguments **AGAINST** gender open parenting are everywhere - in the news, on tv, online - we need to **PROTECT** our own well-being by insisting dissenting opinions be kept **TO YOURSELF!**





